LB 92, 115, 119, 193

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir.

SENATOR MURPHY: Our rules provide that a statement of intent shall be on the desk before a bill is introduced. If we do proceed to introduce a bill without such a statement of intent, have we, in effect, negated it or is this lost in a vague area or what would the Chair's ruling be?

PRESIDENT: The Chair, my ruling would be that my Chair is uncomfortable. I think that in the absence of a timely objection we probably waived any defect. I would strongly suggest that the introducer now put it on there but I think this is one of the requirements you may waive unless you make a timely objection.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: We are ready to go to General File.

CLERK: I have some committee reports. Your committee on Public Health to whom was referred LB 92 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be indefinitely postponed, and LB 115 advanced to General File. Signed Senator Richard Lewis. Mr. President, Government Committee gives notice of Executive session at 9 o'clock tomorrow morning, February 4th.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richard Lewis, for what purpose do you ask recognition.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, I would like to make an announcement. I would like to have the Public Health and Welfare Committee be in Executive session at 9 o'clock tomorrow morning and the meeting room can be under the North balcony.

CLERK: Mr. President, Public Health reports LB 119 to General File.

PRESIDENT: We are now ready for General File. We are still on Senator DeCamp's motion to bracket LB 193.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is pending, I believe, a motion by Senator DeCamp to bracket LB 193 to February 20th.

PRESIDENT: Yes. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the bracketing motion. I discussed this with Senator Bereuter and we have worked out some other things on some other bills.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it shall be withdrawn. Senator Bereuter.

CLERK: Mr. President, then Senator Bereuter's motion to amend is still pending.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, also we have worked out some other amendments. I ask unanimous consent to remove this amendment.

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
