CLERK: 31 ayes, 8 nays, 10 present and not voting.

Mr. President, your committee on Public Works to whom was referred LB 227 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File; LB 396 General File; and LB 24 indefinitely postponed. Mr. President, your committee on Public Health to whom was referred LB 138 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File as amended. CLERK: LB 13, read title. There are committee amendments offered by Senator George's committee on Urban Affairs.

PRESIDENT: Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The committee amendments briefly simply allow...this is enabling legislation...it simply allows the individual cities to either use the proposed method of blue striping along those parking lots or putting up proper signs. It also expands the bill, not only for paraplegics, but also for other handicapped people. There was no opposition to this bill in the committee hearings. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion regarding the committee... Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, as the introducer of the bill, I would say that they are good amendments from the committee and I hope they adopt them.

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
