

PRESIDENT: The question is shall this bill be advanced. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Are you going to move to put the House under Call, Senator Savage?

PRESIDENT: Please vote. Are there any other senators who want to vote before Senator Savage makes his next motion? Record the vote. Make your motion please, Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I move that we go under Call.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 12 nays to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. All senators kindly return to your desks. Nonsenatorial personnel leave the floor of the Legislature. Record your presence please. Would the Sergeant at Arms secure the presence of all members of this Legislature. Record your presence please. Senator Venditte.

CLERK: Senator Goodrich voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kahle.

CLERK: Duis voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, would you please record your presence. Senator Newell. Senator Moylan. Would the Sergeant at Arms find Senator Koch please. Senator Maresh. Would the Sergeant at Arms find Senator Shirley Marsh. I'm just inquiring. Five are excused.

CLERK: Senator Moylan voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: We're missing Senator Shirley Marsh and Senator Koch. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, if those two came and voted aye it would not be enough, so I'm going to move that the Call be raised.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I'd ask for a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Call the roll.

CLERK: Took roll call vote. (Found on page 396 of the Journal).

PRESIDENT: Roll call vote. Roll call vote.

CLERK: This is the motion to advance. (Continued to take roll).

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage.
