

patrol considers it to be a farm product. The scale operators in most areas consider it to be a farm product. There is no clear definition and therefore by outlining in the statute which is really a farm product we hope to remove that discrepancy. I believe that there should be more equal administration of the law by virtue of having those farm products described in the statute.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the advancement of this bill. Record your vote. Record the vote Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays and 21 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. We go back now to LB254 which is the fourth item under General File. Senator Carstens bill.

CLERK: Read LB 254

PRESIDENT: Senator Don Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, fellow members of the legislature. The committee amendments affect only the title. The title says to remove the occupation tax on bottle clubs and that should be corrected to read to allow occupation tax on bottle clubs. I might point out also that in the committee statement and the intent of the bill in the second paragraph it says in 1943 the Legislature removed from the state law the requirement of bottle clubs and that should read 1973 rather than 1943. That is not an amendment that is just pointing out a correction in the intent. The amendment is to insert the word "remove" and delete the word "remove" and insert the word "allow". I move the adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the legislature. The amendment really was the crux of the whole bill as Senator Dworak had said that when we removed the bottle club requirement we also removed the permit for the occupation tax. This is a permissive type legislation and only reinstates that which was removed when that bottle club bill went through. There are not many cases in the state that this is a problem but there are a few. One of which was in my district. As you will notice by the committee report the League of Municipalities were in support of it and also the liquor commission. I move for the advancement of the bill as amended, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The question is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Alright clear the machine and we will have to vote again. Record your votes. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.
