There has been a court case up there in terms of the distribution of apportionment funds as it relates to Class one and Class six schools. The committee felt that in regard to Senator Reutzel's request there should be clarification of the distribution of these funds. We would ask that the bill be introduced.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to refer.
