SENATOR MERZ: Well, if that's the law, I guess there's no way of changing that.

SENATOR STONEY: I guess I'm alright on that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh. Senator Stoney do you wish to close debate?

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, I don't think that there's anything additional that need be said. I would move that LB 115 be advanced from General File to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, 15 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 119.

CLERK: Read title to LB 119. There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. LB 119 adds to those health care providers podiatrists which are foot doctors to join a mutual insurance pool to insure themselves in the case that they cannot provide for themselves medical malpractice insurance. The profession in Nebraska and the United States had a scare this last fall that was serious and that their insurance was to be cancelled January 31, 1977. They are working under an arrangement with the insurance company that is shaky at best and it certainly would be in the best interest of medicine in Nebraska if LB 119 were passed. I move that we advance LB 119 to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the advancement of LB 119. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record your vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay, 18 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: LB 30. Read title to LB 30. Mr. President, there are both committee amendments and other amendments pending. Committee amendment is Senator Keyes.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Keyes for purpose of the committee amendments.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I've talked it over with Vince. In the copy that is in your book, there is a typographical error on two places. How shall we correct them? The amendment that I have and the amendment that you have are right but the one that is in the book is wrong. There's been a typographical error when it was printed.

CLERK: This is one of those things that we can't explain and as much as they're all a computer printout from E & R and how they vary, I don't really know. They both bear the same request number.
