

left it that the city could make a determination how they were going to handle it in terms of a device to identify. The paraplegics have the wheelchair which is always there. Other handicapping conditions, you don't necessarily have a national emblem that so indicates. We felt it would be best that we allow each individual city to determine what type of marking they are going to use to identify those who should be eligible for this kind of parking in their cities. But you say "shall", that makes it binding. I suggest if you do anything that that should be changed to "may" and allow each city government to make their determination.

SENATOR MILLS: Senator Koch, you asked me a question. I would entertain that you are correct. It should be changed to "may". When we discussed LB 13, Senator Koch, there was some concern by Senator Marsh and I believe Senator Chambers concerning the bill as it is stated now that in those areas in that somebody who abused parking in that area could be towed away. So what I am trying to do is get it so that you can have a card on the dash and this seems to be a compromise in that it would establish a card of significance that would be accepted across the state and has been, I believe, in the City of Omaha. So it has been brought forth from some national work done in this area. It isn't something that would be not like in one place not like the other. I think it should be changed to "may", Senator Koch.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator Mills, I don't think we can amend that now.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: No, this cannot be amended. You have to take it back and bring it back again.

SENATOR KOCH: We will just let it come back.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: If you want to bring it right back, you may do so. The motion is the Mills amendment as it was brought back for action. Any other discussion? No further discussion. All those in favor of the Mills amendment will vote aye, opposed no. Requires 25.

SENATOR MILLS: Are you going to do that, Jerry?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on motion to adopt the amendment.
