

CLERK: Record vote read.

PRESIDENT: I think we had better destruct that sheet, Mr. Clerk. These 4th graders over here wonder what is happening. Clear the Board, will you, Mr. Clerk. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: Record vote read. 40 ayes, 4 nays, 3 present and not voting, 2 absent and not voting. (Pages 500,501, Journal.)

PRESIDENT: LB 211 passes on Final Reading. That completes Final Reading. In the South balcony watching this exhibition this morning are 65 4th graders from Rockbrook School in Omaha. That is in Senator Koch's District and they are accompanied by Mrs. Reed, Mr. Baxter and Miss Bowen. Thank you very much for being here. Do you have anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: We go to Select File. The first item is to be struck on Select File, Senator Cullan and members. Both LB 220 and 220A are to be held over. That is Senator Schmit's request. Commence with LB 66, Senator.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I move that the E & R amendments to LB 66 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. The question is the adoption of the amendments. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. They are adopted.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I move that LB 66 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a motion to bracket LB 22 until March 1, 1977, signed Senator Stoney.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I discussed this earlier with Senator Swigart and I think he is in agreement. The reason that I am asking that this bill be bracketed is that last week I brought to the body's attention a letter that had been sent to each member of the Legislature from Mr. Monahan, a member of the State Board of Education. Since receiving his letter, I have talked with Anne Campbell, as I indicated that I would, the Commissioner of Education. I sent her all information pertaining to this issue. She is at the present time reviewing this information and will be getting back to me. I have also received telephone calls from some of the parents in the Omaha area who advised me that they would like to have a little additional time on this particular issue, and I think to provide them with this time and to provide Commissioner Campbell with the opportunity to give me a response to what my concerns were, I would appreciate having this bill bracketed until March 1st.
