SENATOR WARNER: Thank you, Jack. I indicated I think to you yesterday that I was perfectly willing to make some amendments that would help the state treasurers. I guess after the questions that the department, I assume, brought the issue to the Legislature, if they aren't interested in resolving it, to assist, then I guess I am not interested either. I think I will just join with you to kill the bill and we will not be harrasing the public that way, that happen to have five..that they have to have five vehicles to have them registered all at one time. So maybe your suggestion is the best solution, if the department is unwilling to come forth with an amendment to straighten it out. I think now that is a good idea. Let's kill the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I never had much interest in the bill and I still don't but we have discussed it far more than we care to and, obviously, we can't resolve it. So let's go ahead and kill it.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to close debate on your motion, Senator Mills?

SENATOR MILLS: Yes, I will be all in favor of killing the bill and next year we will bring it in as properly written. I do want to clarify a statement, Senator Warner, that the department did not say that they wouldn't bring in an amendment, that the county treasurers have said that they would not ask for a clarifying amendment. This all happened yesterday morning. Some of them have not had a chance, I am sure, to respond. Any action upon my part should not be construed to be an opinion of either the Department of Motor Vehicles or the county treasurers of the State of Nebraska. It was my motion. It was my wording. It was my action. So please do not construe that to be their thinking.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall LB 123 be indefinitely postponed? Record your vote. Please vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 11 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Do you want to move the bill, Senator Mills. Oh, no, it has been moved, hasn't it?
