

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced, Senator Warner. LB 477 now.

CLERK: Read title to LB 477. There are no committee amendments, Mr. President. Senator Warner offers an amendment on page 477. (Read Warner amendment found on page 537 of the Journal).

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, that is a typographical error. The original bill was written, Agency 25, in reference to the Department of Education. Their designated number is Agency 13. So it is corrective. I move its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Question is the adoption of these amendments. Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on motion to adopt the Warner amendment.

PRESIDENT: They are adopted, Senator.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that LB 477 be advanced from General File to E & R initial. You'll recall the bill was introduced. This makes the correction in the appropriation for the state aid to elementary and secondary schools. Between the Special Session of '75 and the regular Session of '76, \$2½ million of the approved \$55 million appropriation was inadvertently left out. This makes no change in the total of the \$55 million, but it brings it up to that. It is merely corrective of the appropriation. Both of these bills, incidentally, were approved by the Governor too, or at least he had brought bills to be introduced, but we had already done so. So there is no controversy on either one.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? Question is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 99.

CLERK: Read title to LB 99. Mr. President, the bill was first considered yesterday, at which time the title was read and the bill was under discussion at that time.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to lay the bill over until Wednesday. I've conferred with the Speaker about that.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered, Senator Lewis. LB 219.

CLERK: Read title to LB 219. There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Shirley Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, the purpose of this bill is to correct an inequity in the sales and income tax law. The tax credit, which is designed to compensate Nebraskans for the sales tax they pay on food purchases, is based on the exemptions claimed on the federal returns. No credit
