PRESIDENT: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body. I move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: Do I see five seconds? I do. The question is shall debate now cease. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Debate ceases. Senator Moylan, would you care to close on your motion to advance.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. Chairman, yes, I would like to close. I don't believe there is much I can say. This has been discussed up and down and around and around for a couple of years so all I will say is that I urge you to vote to advance LB 103 to E & F initial.

PRESIDENT: The question is the advancement of this bill. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 3 nays, 6 present and not voting, 4 absent and not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. Do you have something, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dworak asks unanimous consent to use the West Chamber this day for a Miscellaneous Subjects Committee hearing if it should be needed. Mr. President, a Resolution by Senator Koch, LR 14, extending personal encouragement and that of our offices to the Town Meeting Project. It will be read in and laid over, Mr. President. That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The next bill up is the death penalty bill. It is now.... Ten minutes to dispose of the death penalty bill. Senator Savage, did you wish to be recognized? Well that may be up, but we'd like to hear from the Speaker next.

CLERK: The Speaker is gone.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simon, for what purpose do you ask recognition?

SENATOR SIMON: Mr. President, I was going to comment on the bill. I still have not received the Attorney General's opinion, so I think it would be pointless to have discussion on this matter.

PRESIDENT: You mean on the death penalty bill?

SENATOR SIMON: Yes.

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
