

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills would you close debate on this matter please?

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, several days ago when Senator Lamb's motion prevailed, there was a lot of confusion on the floor of the Legislature and I talked to several members in here who thought they were amending the part on the non-resident area. What they're doing is what they could be doing by the motion that Senator Lamb was adopted, could be taking away \$300,000 to \$400,000 to the revenues to the Game and Parks Department. It's very possible and if you want to live with that then those monies that don't come back to your district I hope that you won't go out and say, say we need more money here. The concern that Senator Lamb has is not the same concern that I have. He is not concerned about those people out there who are concessionaires and make a living along these lakes and streams of Nebraska and run these as Senator Mahoney used to say, "these mama and papa grocery stores". They are the ones who are providing a livelihood for themselves from this and I have had a number of them call and tell me if this bill is not passed they are really going to be in dire trouble. I would ask you to remember today a nonresident who would like to come here the state of Nebraska and buy an annual fishing permit is asked to pay \$30, \$30, today if he comes here and wants to fish for three days, we're asking for \$10. I don't think that's unfair. I do think that you're making a mistake and have made a mistake perhaps in not hearing the discussion on the amendment as presented by Senator Lamb and it will and it could cost \$300,000. I'd ask you to adopt this amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Mills' amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Record. Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: I request a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the House go under call. Record your vote.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 3 nays.

PRESIDENT: The House is under call. Please return to your desk and record your presence. Record your presence, please.

CLERK: Senator Carsten voting aye on the original motion. Maresh voting aye on the original motion. Dworak voting aye on the original motion. Senator Fitzgerald voting aye. Moylan voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: I move the call.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the call be raised. Clear the board. Record your vote on raising the call. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays to raise the call.

PRESIDENT: Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President. 10 nays.
