

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Here comes Senator Kelly if you want to take up his first. I believe his was first. Senator Kelly, you had a motion to return LB 389 for a specific amendment.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move we return LB 389 to Select File for a specific amendment and the specific amendment would include a sunset section in 389 and in three years the Department of Education would return to the Legislature to show the activities in detail of what they have done with the appropriations which this Legislature would make for the displaced homemakers, and at that time, we can be sure that the efforts that this Legislature desires are being carried out on LB 389. I move we return the bill.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any discussion on the Kelly motion to return LB 389 for this specific amendment? If not, all those in favor of returning LB 389 for the Kelly specific amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, 21 present and not voting, 2 absent and not voting.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion carries and LB 389 is returned for the specific Kelly amendment.

CLERK: The specific amendment is found on page 611 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move to amend LB 389 as the amendment shows on page 611 of the Legislative Journal, which, to repeat, would be a sunset amendment causing the Department of Education to be alerted that this Legislature is very serious about LB 389 and the services that would be available to displaced homemakers by the passage of this bill and we don't want them horsing around with it and we want them to do the work and we would know by the adoption of this amendment. I have talked to the introducer in detail concerning this amendment. She has signified complete support and it is my hope that she would discuss this amendment at this time.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Maxey.

SENATOR MAXEY: Mr. President and Senators, I have no objections to these amendments. I think this will add some depth to my bill and let you know that we are sincere in taking care of these displaced homemakers and that we will be ready to come up next year, November the 15th, and tell you the progress we are making and maybe ask for a few more centers.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any further discussion on the Kelly motion to LB 389, the specific amendment. The Chair recognizes Senator Kahle.
