

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any further discussion on consent amendment number 5 by Senator Barnett?

SENATOR BARNETT: Page 14, lines 5 and 6.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: If not, all those in favor of consent amendment number 5 will vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR BARNETT: Seems like we're short one vote here somewhere, Reutzel. Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Record the vote. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Consent amendment is adopted. Chair recognizes Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I wonder if, Mr. Chairman and Mr. Clerk, if it would be okay to take amendments 6 and 7 together. They're basically the same thing. They strike the word "crime" on lines 11, 12 and 13, and remove the penalty. We add the word "felony". I'd like to try it in case somebody objects. We'll just take amendments 6 and 7 together, just to shorten the time.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: You're moving consent amendment 6 and 7.

SENATOR BARNETT: Right. These are request amendments, as you follow on the pages. Page 14, we strike the word "crime" in lines 11, 12 and 13 and insert "felony", leaving the statutes as they presently are, not changing, in the criminal code. Then striking the penalty which is not needed in lines 14 through 16. I'd move for the adoption of both request 6 and 7.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Is there any further discussion on consent amendments 6 and 7, taken together in one motion? If not all those in favor of consent amendment 6 and 7, in one motion, will vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR BARNETT: I think it needs 25 votes, doesn't it, Mr. Chairman?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: This requires 25 votes.

SENATOR BARNETT: Where did everybody go?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We'll wait for a couple of them to get back here. There are some of them coming forward now. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, 22 not voting.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Consent amendments 6 and 7, taken together in one motion, are adopted. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Now, if we could, I'd like to go through this bill section by section. If you have any questions on these, as we go through Article 2 by the sections, if you can address them to me I'll try to answer them. If not, I'll try to relate them to the Chair or to Senator DeCamp to assist in this area.
