SENATOR BARNETT: I'll change it on Select.

PRESIDENT: That might be better, unless you can get it up here by unanimous consent. If there's any controversy...

SENATOR BARNETT: I don't really believe there will be and I ask for unanimous consent, motion to do that. I want to change the 300,000 to 150,000,

PRESIDENT: 300,000 to 150,000?

SENATOR BARNETT: That's right. On Page 3, line 8 and 9.

PRESIDENT: Write it up and we'll try it.

SENATOR BARNETT: I can do it the other way; it doesn't make any difference.

PRESIDENT: All right, then you're going to wait on Select File?

SENATOR BARNETT: I'll do that; I don't want to hold it up here.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of LB 304 and the motion to advance? That's the question. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 374 does have amendments, by the introducer. Read LB 374. There are committee amendments by Senator George's Urban Affairs Committee.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I have just recently discussed this bill with Senator Cullan and I believe Senator Cullan has a motion and maybe you can facilitate it if Senator Cullan would come first.

PRESIDENT: Chair then recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, the committee amendments to LB 374 were amendments which I submitted and after later researching the bill, we found some problems with the amendments which the committee adopted. I have submitted another amendment to take care of the problem which arose from the committee amendments and therefore I would urge the Legislature...I suppose we would first have to reject the committee amendments. Should I go into the intent of the bill, Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: This is your bill. Are you suggesting that the committee amendments should be defeated and yours substituted therefore?

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes, that's correct, because of a defeat in the committee amendments.

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
