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can best learn about the voting procedures on the floor, why a Senator votes on such a bill, some floor maneuvers and these techniques can best be learned by sitting along side a senator or at least on the side. Therefore I would respectfully request that this body vote in favor of Senator Koch's motion.

PRESIDENT: Do I see five second? I see five seconds. The question is shall debate now cease. Record your vote. Please vote. We are voting on closing debate on the motion to suspend the rules. Record.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 10 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, I think that I am going to have to agree with the Executive Board on this. I certainly have nothing against the JC's. I think that it is a fine organization. If we are going to do this for one organization I think that Senator Marvel is absolutely right. What is going to keep us from doing it for the League of Women Voters? We are going to have people down here on the floor all of the time. It is already confusing enough to do this. Certainly I would have to go with the Executive Board and vote against this.

PRESIDENT: They won't see much if we discuss this all day. Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Just a quick comment and I agree with what Senator Marvel has said. I know that this is a fine group and I wish that we could grant the exception, but if we grant it for one we grant it for all. We grant it for school children, the American Association of University Women comes down, we grant it for the them, the Junior League I think that it is a poor precedent to establish. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Ditto.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch, close debate. Excuse me, Senator Chambers. I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman I was not going to challenge you. What I was going to say that if there was any group that I would suspend the rules for it would be school children. I'm going to vote against the motion today but that does not mean that I might not in the future offer a motion to suspend the rules for the benefit of children. Grown people are able to read, they can talk to senators and make phone calls and come down here individually or however they want to to find out what is going on in the Legislature, after being here six years going on my seventh I have observed others who have been here longer and some shorter time and still there is not complete knowledge of the legislative processes, I doubt that sitting on the floor this short time is going to make that much difference anyway, so I'm against suspending the rules allowing this change.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes.
