

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Marvel, Senator Warner would like to introduce some bills if he can get the thirty votes, so... do you want to hold off your motion to adjourn until that? Until we try this?

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes.

CLERK: Read Standing Committee Report from Public Works. LB 178 and 379 indefinitely postponed.

Mr. President, I move to place LB241 on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee. That will be read and laid over. Signed, Senator Swigart.

Mr. President, I move to suspend the rules, Rule 5, Section 5 and introduce request 814, 805, 790, 813 and 678. Signed, Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, the Chair would like to suggest that you put the House under Call right now.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the House be under Call.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the question is shall the House go under Call. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call. All Senators please return to your desks and record your presence. Would the Sergeant at Arms please secure the membership. While we are waiting for the membership to record, open the board please, while we are waiting for the senators to record their presence we will hear from Senator Warner regarding the introduction of these bills. Senator.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the legislature there are five separate bills, the purpose of them have been passed out and if anybody wants to object to one of them, I'll drop it out so...I'll explain each of them as a reason for suspending the rules in order to get them introduced. All of them deal with cash funds. They are adjustments that are necessary. Request 814 increases the limitation of cash funds at the Arrow Space Museum and the reason it is increased from \$400 to \$1,000 they take in admissions, sell a variety of things at that museum, they now are required because of that \$400 limitation to make deposits two or three times a day, this would increase it to avoid that necessity of making those frequent trips during the day. The second request 813, establishes a cash fund so that the Arts Council where they have various activities where admission is charged that they have a means of processing that funds which they currently do not have. LB790 creates a cash...a petty cash fund, the problem that exists here is primary out-state areas, the one example that I can give you would be at Ft. Rob where they might need some minor things, pencils, what have you. It costs more to process a voucher in order to go in and buy a few minor items than it would if they could do it out of a petty cash fund, which will still be accounted, it is something that was recommended and suggested by the State Auditor in his audit of those various agencies. Request 805 makes no change. It
