LB 58, 487

SENATOR NICHOL: Well it's better than 50¢.

SENATOR DWORAK: Is it adequate?

SENATOR NICHOL: I suppose so. The only thing I can relay to you is that they felt that \$1.50 was more adequate. Whether or not they can prove that \$1.50 was actually the amount required or not, I don't know. I feel that the dollar will be okay for a year, or two, or three. If it doesn't amount to enough in the future I guess we can change it then.

SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the committee amendment? Any close, Senator DeCamp? The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: You are in trouble now, Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: I don't think there is any need for a closing. I think we explained the bill. If there are any questions, okay.

PRESIDENT: You are moving to advance the bill?

SENATOR NICHOL: I move we advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: That is the question. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 18 nays on motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Senator Lewis wants to pass this bill, as I understand it. So we go to LB 307. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: That was the first bill on the list that we passed, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: No. You said your first bill. Well, if you want to take it up fine.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes. There is no problem with this one.

PRESIDENT: Alright. LB 487.

CLERK: Read title to LB 487. There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: First, Mr. President, I apologize. I was speaking in reference to 427, which was the first on the list. LB 487 is simply a bill to clarify the distribution of apportionment money. The bill was introduced at the request of Senator Barry Reutzel from Fremont. In Dodge County there was a suit in terms of how you apportion money between class ones and class six schools. The court ruled that class one schools were entitled to apportionment money. So we devised the figures for taxing the census and for distribution of the apportionment money consistent with the court decision in Dodge County. I'd ask that the bill be advanced.

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
