SENATOR SWIGART: Mr. President, colleagues. Could I ask Senator Maxey a question please?

SENATOR MAXEY: Yes.

SENATOR SWIGART: Senator Maxey, would you explain what class of cities this pertains to.

SENATOR MAXEY: Primary cities.

SENATOR SWIGART: It does not have anything to do with metropolitan?

SENATOR MAXEY: None at all.

SENATOR SWIGART: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 311.

CLERK: Read title to LB 311. There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I've got caught looking here. There is a fiscal note here that I would like to share with you, if I may. Would you pass over this and come back to it the next time. I'll get the information together.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to come back to it today?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Right away, right next bill, if you will.

PRESIDENT: Right away? Alright, we'll take another bill and then come back to you.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Alright. We'll go to LB 398. Senator Kahle. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Read title to LB 398.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President, members of the body. I didn't really expect this bill to get up this morning. I think we might as well talk about it now as any time. I know many of you think that possibly this bill came to me through your former Senator and colleague, Gene Mahoney. This is not true. It did come to me through the Public Officials Organization for state people. Really, when I got interested in it was when I was campaigning this summer and found that the people that live out in the state, and my neighbors, could not, in any way, take part in any political activity. The Game and Parks people are scattered all over the State of Nebraska.
