LB 88, 38

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: A question of Senator Labeledz if I may.

PRESIDENT: I think she left the Chamber, Senator.

SENATOR MURPHY: Fine, I'll pass.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall 88 be returned to Select File for this amendment. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned, Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman, I would move for the adoption of the amendment. It would read as follows: in a work period of 28 consecutive days, the employee receives for four tours of duty, which in the aggregate exceed 200 hours. So you insert the word "for" and you insert "four" following that. That's the specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? The question is the adoption of this specific amendment. Record your vote. Vote again. Now the board is open...now we're off and running. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion is adopted. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature. I move that LB 88 as amended be advanced to E & R for En-grossment.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced. That completes Select File. We'll go back then to the special order of the criminal code, LB 38.

CLERK: Mr. President, there was pending on LB 38 an amend-ment by Senator Chambers. It's found on page 733 of the Legislative Journal. The specific amendment that was pending was identified as the Chamber Amendment No. 2 reading page 28, strike line 7 and 19. It's now my understanding Senator Chambers wishes to withdraw that amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And offer in lieu thereof an amendment which Senator DeCamp and I have worked out and it will accomplish what each of us is interested with reference to Section 49 and Section 50. If you would like me to state or have the Clerk read the amendment and then I will explain what it does, then Senator DeCamp will confirm.

PRESIDENT: You want to withdraw it?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

PRESIDENT: It's withdrawn.

CLERK: Now Mr. President, offering the following amendment in lieu thereof to amend the DeCamp amendment adopted on March 8 found on page 742 of the Journal. Read amendment. (Refer to page 308). Signed Senator Chambers.
