CLERK: That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Introduction of bills.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to suspend Rule 5, section 5 and introduce the attached bill. Signed by Senator Kahle. It is request #817 pertaining to local government revenue sharing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kahle, to suspend the rules to introduce the bill.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President and members of the body, this is a bill to correct some language in the rules of revenue sharing that we are receiving in the State of Nebraska that goes to the counties. There was a certain stipulation in the old regulations from the federal government that the counties had to go through a certain process in order to receive these funds. This process has been eliminated in the federal law and this bill is to eliminate it in the state law. This is the purpose of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kahle, the Clerk has just advised me that this bill comes in at the request of the Governor, is that correct?

SENATOR KAHLE: This is correct.

PRESIDENT: We do not need to suspend the rules.

SENATOR KAHLE: I didn't think you did.

PRESIDENT: It is Monday morning. Senator Duis, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR DUIS: A question of Senator Kahle, if I might, in regard to this. Senator Kahle, does this merely affect rules and regulations or the statute itself. I thought I heard about rules and regulations in there.

SENATOR KAHLE: I believe it affects the statutes itself of the State of Nebraska.

SENATOR DUIS: I wanted to make sure because if it only affected the rules and regulations, there would be no need of the introduction of the bill.

CLERK: No, it amends a statute.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 519. Read title. That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: At the order of the Speaker, there shall be a deviation from the agenda. Instead of going directly into Final Reading, we will have a resolution.

CLERK: Legislative Resolution #25 introduced by Senator Savage. Read. (See pages 817 and 818, Journal.) Mr. President, a motion on the desk. Read motion. (See page 818, Journal.)
