PRESIDENT: Senator Duis, your light was off when I asked him to close. The question is, shall this matter be referred to committee? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, I think this matter is important enough that I would ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the House go under Call? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 10 nays.

PRESIDENT: We are under Call. All Senators please return to your desks and record your presence. Please record your presence. Would the Sergeant at Arms go to the Supreme Court hearing room and get the Appropriations Committee please. Would you ask them to return to the Chamber? Well, when we are under Call, they are to be on the floor, not in committee hearings. Record your presence, please. Senator Schmit. Senator Hefner. Senator Lamb. Senator Dworak.

CLERK: Senator Marvel voting no on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark voting no on the original motion.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no. (Mike off) voting aye. Senator Savage voting aye.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to return LR 24 to committee. For what purpose do you ask recognition, Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I rise to ask for a roll call vote on the matter at hand.

PRESIDENT: Commence the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See pages 828 and 829, Journal.) 20 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. There is a motion to raise the Call. Clear the Board. Senator Barnett made the motion, I think. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I would move for the adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I am not going to speak anymore on this issue. I am just going to explain my vote. Without the knowledge and study of the issue and without referring it to committee, I fully intend to vote no.
