The question is the adoption of Senator Burrows amendment which is to add Adams to the Class A resolution. Record your vote. Have you voted? Senator Burrows amendment. Record the vote.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 17 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Now, all right, the question is the adoption of Senator Stoney's resolution. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: Mr. President, an explanation of vote, had I been present, we would have voted aye on LR 24. Signed Senator Lewis and Senator Murphy. That is all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: General File. Senator Chambers.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers asked to bracket LB 64 until March 23rd.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection?

CLERK: The bill has been brought up before.

PRESIDENT: There is no objection. It is so ordered. Senator Koch, we have 109.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 109 introduced by the Constitution Revision and Recreation Committee. Read title. This bill has been considered before. The committee amendments have been adopted. There is...the Reutzel amendments have been adopted and there is now pending a motion by Senator Reutzel to amend as follows: Read. (See page 830, Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. President and members of the body, the amendment we handed out this morning gave everyone, I think, ample time to look at it. It is a simple amendment. It is added into the amendments we already adopted last Friday and what it does is to simply strike out the objectionable sections for the Tax Commissioner and they need a warrant now to search under the provisions of the bill. I would move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I guess Senator Reutzel will have to tell me which amendment, you said the sections which were objectionable. Does that mean the enacting clause section, too? I would like to have you read that amendment. You said the objectionable sections and I wondered if that included the enacting clause, too.

SENATOR REUTZEL: No, it doesn't, Senator.

SENATOR BARNETT: Which sections were you talking about?
