LB 137, 138, 138A, 179,  
179A, 199, 205, 218

PRESIDENT: Would the senators please return to their desks? All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is shall LB 137 pass. Record your vote.

CLERK: Read record vote on page 841 of the Journal. 46 ayes, 0 nays. Senator Kelly voting aye. 3 not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 137 passes. Please read LB 138.

CLERK: Read LB 138.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is shall LB 138 pass. Record your vote. This bill has the emergency clause attached. Record.

CLERK: Read LB 138A, 179, 179A, 199, and 205.

(Machine turned off while bills were read).

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly for what purpose do you ask recognition?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. LB 218, Senator Rasmussen has an interest in this bill to amend it. Senator Rasmussen is absent today; he has a legal problem up in Howard County and can't be with us. I respectfully request a one-day bracket on LB 218 for Senator Rasmussen's return. Does that take a motion?

PRESIDENT: Yes, it does.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I move we bracket LB 218 for March 16.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. Record your vote. I'm sorry, I didn't see your light Senator Mills. Do you want to be heard, Senator Mills?

SENATOR MILLS: Yes.

PRESIDENT: The Chair made an error in calling for the vote without checking the board. Would you cancel this vote please?

SENATOR MILLS: I have a question of the Speaker, Mr. President. Do we have Final Reading on March 16 Mr. Speaker? What I'm asking in reality, I guess, how long would the bill be held because I know that we don't have Final Reading every day.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We do have tomorrow.

SENATOR MILLS: Then Senator Kelly, do you have Senator Rasmussen...will you print his amendment in the Journal?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, yes I'll check with Senator Rasmussen's staff and be sure that whatever it is he wants is printed in the Journal today.

SENATOR MILLS: I have some concern and of course I'll certainly leave it up to the members of the Legislature what they care to do with LB 218. I have some concern about it in this manner
