

children and we've never camped in a state park in my life. I think that there are people who need those systems and ought to have them and ought to have the opportunity to participate in the support of those systems. It should not be done at general taxpayer expense. That's what the bill is trying to do and that's what I have in mind. That's what Senator Reutzel believes in. I believe a majority of members of the Legislature believe in it and I would hope that you would not nickel and dime it to death. That's what we're doing. What in the dickens is it going to make to someone who drives in in a \$7,000 automobile pulling a \$3,000 to \$30,000 recreational vehicle whether he pays \$1.00 or \$1.50? It's not going to make any difference. You know it isn't. Let's stop being ridiculous and let's get on with the bill. We've got a lot of things we need to talk about that are more important to me and every other member of this Legislature than whether we save 50¢ on a user fee on this bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel calls for the previous question. Do I see five seconds? I do not, I do. Record your vote on that proposition. Please vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 2 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, a question of the introducer of the amendment. Senator Simon is it your amendment, the amendment to the amendment? Senator Simon, as you understand it, the state does have certain areas of which they provide campgrounds and do charge. They have several areas in the state of Nebraska. Then with this amendment as you are proposing, they would have to have a, if a non-resident, they would have to have a \$2.00 fee plus paying the fee to the state of Nebraska for camping there. Is that correct?

SENATOR SIMON: Yes.

SENATOR MILLS: Thank you. I have some great concern about this particular area in that the state of Nebraska does have campgrounds and in some areas, do provide for electricity and water for those persons using the campgrounds. I feel that Senator Schmit, I believe yesterday mentioned the, or maybe Senator Koch, mentioned the similarity of being involved in the competition of other campgrounds. Certainly this would put Nebraska, in certain areas, at a higher price than those particular campgrounds in Nebraska that are operating on a free-enterprise system. Consequently, I don't really believe that there ought to be the extra additional fee on those state campground areas in which that, whether it's a resident or a non-resident, is paying a fee to camp. I think that is perhaps unfair for resident or non-resident in those particular areas. I don't think this bill addresses that, but it is a problem of which the introducer might want to work around.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President, members of the body. I think we should reject both of these amendments and leave the bill the way it was. I'm trying to get some information; I was hoping I'd get a call before now to see what the KOA rates are, but if I remember correctly they are much higher than that. They are in the \$5.00 range rather than in the \$1.00 or
