

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I'm sure my timing is very bad, but I'm going to offer an amendment. I'm going to withdraw it and I'll offer it on Select File because it is a sincere motion, as the others have been. The motion is to go ahead and approve the committee for purposes of study. I do have a concern that we keep establishing special committees to hear bills. I feel very strongly that special committees for purposes of study should not act as the standing committee during the session to hear bills. I think they ought to be referred to the appropriate standing committees. I think the worst direction we can go is to add to committees that listen to bills and act on them. I started to write it out and I do not have it written well, but I will offer such an amendment on Select File. It is for the purpose of not perforating the number of committees that listen to bills during the session. I'll withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Alright. Now, Senator Clark, do you have any closing at this time? The motion then is the advancement of LB 401 to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 3 nays, remainder not voting.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 401 is advanced to E & R initial.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Frank Lewis asks unanimous consent to hold LB 22 on Final Reading until March 23rd, it is presently set for the 22nd, no, it's presently set for the 17th.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: That would be almost a week?

CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Is there any objection to Senator Frank Lewis' unanimous consent request? If not, so ordered. Any other matters?

CLERK: That is all.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Savage, do you wish to make a motion to recess until 1:30?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. Speaker, I motion to recess until 1:30.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion to recess until 1:30. All in favor say aye, opposed nay. We are in recess until 1:30.
