

hearing of this voice, then that is the Government Committee's bill and sunset law. We will go on down then to... the Legislature will be in session. We will go on down then to the next bill after the Government Committee bill, 257, go to LB 264, Banking Committee. That is a Banking Committee bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 264.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Just a minute, Mr. Clerk. Senator DeCamp, do you wish to put this one over today. Do you want to pass it by today?

CLERK: Mr. President, this bill has come up and been laid over twice.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I move the bill be advanced to Select File.

CLERK: LB 264. Read title. There are no committee amendments.

SENATOR DeCAMP: We explained this bill one time and Senator Burrows had some questions. I don't think we have satisfactorily answered all his questions yet. He has agreed to let it go ahead and we will get together with him and see if any additional amendments are needed in the future on it. Is that all right? This was on the noncontroversial bill list and we passed over it a couple of times and I want to get this moved so we can get something figured out in the future.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Burrows, do you wish to... Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: I will let it go to Select. It is okay with me if we do that, but if I don't get some input from staff on this thing, I am going on a kill motion.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any other discussion on LB 264? Seeing none, Senator DeCamp, would you wish to close? The motion then is to advance LB 264 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? We only need a couple of more votes here. Please vote. If you are going to vote, vote, otherwise I am going to recognize...there it is. Mr. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on motion to advance.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 264 is advanced to E & R Initial. LB 180.

CLERK: LB 180. Read title. There are no committee amendments, Mr. President. There was a motion to amend by Senator Bereuter which amendment was adopted. The bill failed to advance on March 4th.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: There was an amendment, you say.

CLERK: It has been adopted.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Been adopted. So the only thing is the bill. All right. The motion is on the advancement. The Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.
