

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Venditte offers some amendments to have attached to Legislative Resolution No. 27. LR 27 has already gone to the Executive Board for referral. (Refer to page 922).

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any objection to printing Senator Venditte's amendments? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hefner asked unanimous consent to add his bill to LB 518.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Hefner. Chair recognizes Senator Hefner on this matter.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature. I would like to add my name to LB 518. I thought that I had it on. I thought that I had signed that bill, but I don't know what happened.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: I guess the explanation is that the rules were suspended and a number of names were added and yours just didn't get on.

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, I'm a member of that committee.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: He's on the committee so we'll take this as a unanimous consent request, Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Thank you.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any objections? Senator Duis, the bill is 518 I believe. This is merely a request to add a name to LB 518, unanimous consent request by a member of the committee Senator Hefner, whose name was inadvertently omitted when they added names. Does that explanation suit everybody? Any objection? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: That's all Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We're then ready for General File. LR 273 was under debate.

CLERK: Read LB 273. There is pending the Frank Lewis amendment to amend. There is pending yet a series of amendments to that amendment. The next one is offered by Senator Chambers to amend the Lewis amendment. Read amendment. (Refer to page 922).

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature. I have stated before that I have nothing against Mr. Devaney. As a matter of fact, I've never seen him in real life. I've seen pictures of him and I've seen representations of him on television but if he walked in this room and he could be here now, I wouldn't know him. If he is here, I don't know him. This is a provision which would name the football field after the man that they say symbolizes football in Nebraska now. Memorial Stadium, I understand, was called that in honor of people who perished in various wars that this country has been in. They did not want to name the stadium after Devaney. They did not want to take away the memorial aspect of the stadium, but the football field can be named after Mr. Devaney. They will retain the stadium
