SENATOR MILLS: I want a roll call.

PRESIDENT: Roll call! Oh, alright. That is what that means.

SENATOR MILLS: This is roll call. This is raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: Call the roll.

CLERK: (Took roll call vote found on page 956 of the Journal).  
19 ayes, 26 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills moves that the Call be raised. The motion fails. Record your vote on that question. Record.

CLERK: 23 ayes.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Marsh. (Read Marsh amendment found on pages 956 and 957 of the Journal).

PRESIDENT: Senator Shirley Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This will make a bill passable. Without this amendment 109 probably does not have the support, after its veto by the Governor, to be passed at all. This would add the dollars directly to the General Fund. They can then be appropriated in the regular appropriations process. So that we can continue with the building of the state parks we need additional dollars, and this is one way to add additional dollars. I urge your support for this amendment to LB 109. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I rapidly rise to support this amendment. The earmarking of funds, as Senator Marvel previously eluded to, and I hope we'll talk more pointedly, is absolutely the ruination of budgeting and control of money in the public government. Senator Marsh's amendment is straightforward and to the point. If it's public money it should be appropriated. If it's a tax it should go into the General fund. Hallelujah! Let's support this.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. President, members of the body. I rise in opposition to the Marsh amendment. Senator Marsh didn't say anything about additional money for the Game and Parks System. We're putting this money into General Fund. You know, as well as I do, that this body is not going to appropriate that kind of money from General Fund for the Game and Parks. This bill is designed for the Game and Parks, even the opponents of the bill would say that we need additional money for the Game and Parks. But yet when we have to bring this back to the body to vote on it, we're not going to appropriate the same amount of money to Game
