

CLERK: 24 ayes.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Report the vote.  
The motion carries. The Keyes amendment carries.

CLERK: 26 ayes. 8 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Reutzel, the Call has been raised.  
Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President and members of the Legis-  
lature, I move that LB 419 as amended be advanced to  
E & R.

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, we do have other amendments.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Mills asks to add the  
emergency clause to this bill.

PRESIDENT: Before that, Senator Reutzel has an announce-  
ment. Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. President and members of the body,  
yesterday, Senator Barnett requested that all the amend-  
ments to LB 109 and an explanation be handed out. Those  
are prepared and they will be put in your mail boxes  
so you will have the rest of today and tomorrow and  
Thursday morning to look at the amendments and the impact  
on the bill and I wish you would take the time to do so.

PRESIDENT: Do you have another amendment up? Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I would ask that after that  
particular amendment is put on that we address the situ-  
ation as an emergency and adopt the emergency clause. I  
think it needs to have the emergency clause. The bill is  
passed. It makes no difference. These people go down  
and pay their \$50. There is no use to have to wait until  
next September or October before they can get the bill or  
use the bill so I would ask you to adopt the emergency  
clause.
