

Nichol. Not even a nickel? Okay. You may close, Senator Mills. The question then is the adoption of the emergency clause on LB 419. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, I have to ask for a Call of the House. We have got five, seven, eight guys sitting over there.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: You need a Call of the House. Senator Mills is moving for a Call of the House. Motion is on Call of the House. The Board is open yet.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The emergency clause is adopted. Are there any further amendments? Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 419 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The motion is to advance LB 419 to E & R for engrossment. All in favor say aye, opposed nay. The bill is advanced to E & R for engrossment. LB 419. Next.

CLERK: The bill is LB 421. There are E & R amendments.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I move the E & R amendments to LB 421 be adopted.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 421. Any discussion? All those in favor of adopting the E & R amendments to LB 421 vote aye, opposed nay. The E & R amendments to LB 421 are adopted.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, there are amendments offered by Senator Burrows to LB 421. Read amendment. (See page 911, Journal.)

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Mr. Chairman, I talked to Chairman Kremer about this amendment and he is agreeable to it that these fines and jail sentences are excessive, the possibilities of entrapment again with an individual that either fails to have it. A \$1,000 fine, I think, is far more than what we need to enforce the procedures of this device that would prevent any insecticides from going back into a well. I have no questions on the need of the bill but I think a jail sentence over that gives the regulatory people entirely too much clout when they go out in this and inspect the farmers well for this regulatory device. I think \$1,000 fine is perfectly adequate, even \$500 would be adequate as a maximum fine because once they fine, if the judge or someone refuses to, there are potential jail sentences for refusing to follow the order of the court or paying the fine. So I would so move that we reduce the penalties from a minimum of...what it does, it changes the maximum fine to \$1,000 and strikes the jail sentences provided for in the bill. I move the amendment.
