

then they can put the tubes across and give them one more facility. That was the question and, Mr. Chairman, I think there are many people feel that Omaha National has had a problem there and this certainly will allow you to say, yes, we realize you have a problem and adopt that motion.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Mills amendment. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record. Record vote.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 26 nays, 14 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, another motion to amend by Senator Mills. Read. (See page 1009, Journal.)

SENATOR MILLS: Now, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is to affirm those of you who just voted in the negative that you want this throughout the state and this will allow an extension of feet, to 300 feet. That is only a city block or less than a city block. It certainly takes into consideration those institutions in Lincoln, I want you Lincoln Senators to pay attention, this allows the Lincoln institutions a little bit of leeway there. What is so magic about 200 feet that 300 feet, let's allow that figure. Let everybody participate in LB 77. I think you are being unfair of just putting it 200 feet. Why not put it at 102 feet or 107 feet, let's put it at 300 feet and really affirm what we are trying to do. I believe that 300 feet is fair. I offer this in a most sincere and serious way that I think you should adopt this motion, putting it at 300 feet but not closer than 300 feet to an existing facility. This does allow certain institutions in the state to participate in LB 77 as you have demonstrated you would like to have.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, colleagues, it is my understanding that one of the Lincoln banks is effected and that is Citizen's Bank. They built a detached facility, a facility with tubes and it was ruled by the Banking Commissioner as being a detached facility. So Senator Mills indicated that this did not affect Lincoln while in fact it does affect Lincoln. I also want to mention that we keep talking about the bankers and I think we keep forgetting about the people, the people that are being served by these facilities, and I happen to have some statistics about a facility in Columbus and it serves approximately 14,000 people a month. Now that is a lot of people and this was built at an expense of \$450,000 to this bank and these banks don't spend this kind of money unless they are able to provide a service and I think the statistics point this out. Now to have a technicality as to whether a facility is detached or not by feet, it sounds like we are getting into a position where we want to punish someone. We want to take punitive action in this floor and I think that is not at all, this should not be one of the prerogatives of this legislative body.
