

advise you that the new Reformatory, for instance, does comply with ASHRAE 9075 standards. In addition to that the plans, I think, are going out to interested contractors this week, without modification. All bidders are being advised that a solar, hot water heating system is going to be expected very shortly as an add-on to the contract. But they felt that it was too late to change the plans at this time for solar water heating, but there are definite plans that that will be an add-on to the contract. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Thank you, Mr. President. We certainly appreciate this. I feel that since DAS, especially, will be under a lot of pressure, and the Executive Branch, I think that if we would give approval of this kind of approach from this legislative body it would be much appreciated.

PRESIDENT: Well there is one other item. The Executive Branch certainly appreciates the attitude. There is no attempt to delay any project that has been voted on by this body, but we think it's very important that all of these alternate plans be looked at. The question then before.... Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I, too, issue the hope that we will all join together, that is the Legislative and of course the Administrative Branches, relating to this subject, as I know that you are interested yourself, Mr. President. I have an interest and I did introduce a bill relating to solar energy. The Constitutional Revision Committee has moved that bill forward to the Legislature. We will be addressing this issue. I urge you, those of you who are interested in solar energy, to refer to page 220 of the Journal and look at a resolution that I introduced relating to the same subject, only it goes into depth relating to the advise and assistance of the Dean of the Architecture College, the Dean of the Engineering College to develop a program of education and to examine and to help qualify the engineers and architects relating to the development of solar energy systems for public buildings in the state. I would urge you to support these resolutions and all.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.


PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted.
