LB 481, 21

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move the E & R amendments to LB 481 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. They are adopted.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move that LB 481 as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? All in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced. We're ready for 109. We go to the consent calendar, then to LB 21.

CLERK: Read LB 21. Mr. President, there are committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage.

CLERK: ...by Senator Koch's committee.

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, Senator Koch. Are you familiar with the committee amendment Senator Savage?

SENATOR SAVAGE: I'm familiar with one that we put in on page 4, line 26 after boats insert "except that for rubber rafts reducing the fee from'...

CLERK: That's your amendment, but the committee amendments... do you want to move the adoption of those?

SENATOR SAVAGE: I'll move the adoption of them. I accepted them.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion of the committee amendments? Record your vote. Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I wonder if he can explain the committee amendments as to what they do.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch, could you help us with the... well we're already voting, record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on motion to adopt the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: They are adopted. Now Senator Savage, do you have an amendment?

SENATOR SAVAGE: I have an amendment, yes.

CLERK: The amendment is on page 929 of the Legislative Journal. Read amendment.

SENATOR SAVAGE: We put in the wrong figure. This eliminates having to pay a higher fee for canoes and rubber ducks in the bathtub and things like that. It reduces the fee on vessels less than 12 feet in length, the fee shall be \$9 instead of the original. I move its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay.

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
