LB 238, 483, 74

SENATOR SIMON: Mr. President, I have and I'll bring this down. Senator Newell, I know has some questions about this had some concerns and Senator Fowler is in Appropriations. I have three signatures here and I'm going to have to ask Senator Savage to pull this off consent and handle it through the General File.

PRESIDENT: There are an awful lot of lights...you've got three? This is off. LB 483.

CLERK: Request to bracket 483 until March 31. Signed Senator Duis.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: I would like to know who made that request.

CLERK: Senator Duis.

SENATOR GEORGE: Senator, would you maybe explain...

PRESIDENT: The Speaker...who are the three that.

CLERK: Which bill are we talking about?

PRESIDENT: The last one.

SENATOR GEORGE: 483, the next one right?

PRESIDENT: That's just a bracketing request.

SENATOR GEORGE: I would like to know, this is an Urban Affairs Committee bill, I would like to know...

PRESIDENT: There is a request for unanimous consent to bracket until next week.

SENATOR GEORGE: Could I get some information why? I may not agree.

PRESIDENT: I beg your pardon.

SENATOR GEORGE: I may not agree to that request. I object.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Now who made that motion for unanimous consent? Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Well, being as there is an objection, I guess I'll have to make a motion then because Senator George, if you recall, I had an amendment coming up for this. It has not been prepared as yet and it had to do with some of the people who appeared for the bill. It had to do with Section 1 and 2 of it. I've been in constant telephone conversation with the city attorney at Holdrege. He is helping prepare an amendment and that's the only reason that I ask for its bracketing and I didn't think...

PRESIDENT: Do you want to make a motion then? There is nothing before the House. Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I'll remove my objection.

PRESIDENT: Alright, is there an objection to the bracketing of this bill, 483 til March 31. Seeing none, it's so ordered. Now we go to LB 74.
