

in the city of Omaha and Lincoln and so forth. So if we are going to have a study, will this study include that? Senator Kremer is coming, Senator Schmit. Will this veterinary college, will it provide veterinarians for those or will it provide the veterinarians where we really need them out in rural Nebraska?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, Senator Keyes, as is often the case once you train a veterinarian, you can't chain him to a tree in western Nebraska and make him practice there. He's going to go, as you said, where the money is and the money as Senator Newell has pointed out many times is in Omaha. That's where the dogs and cats are at. You can't hardly ask a man to wrestle a 1200 pound steer for the same money that he can wrestle a 12 ounce chihuahua, you know, and get paid cash for it. The economics are going to determine, I suppose Senator, as you pointed out where they settle. I really think that's about all we can do.

SENATOR KEYES: So actually then by this study we would do nothing more than to see whether we need a veterinarian college in these four state area and when we get the veterinarians trained, they are going to go where the money is. They are not going to go out on the agricultural end of this state. The veterinarian that I hired to work for me when I was in the cattle feeding and hog business, do you know what his business is today? Oh, he will come out to your farm and he will help you do everything on your livestock that you need, \$30, \$40 for a call. I don't blame him because he can go to his hospital and make far more money. So, Senator Kremer, I'd like to ask you a question and then I'm going to sit down. Senator Kremer, how many times... we had a resolution to study the feasibility of having a college within the four states, has the results of that been used or are they just laying on a shelf someplace?

SENATOR KREMER: I don't understand your question, Senator Keyes. You say, we have studied?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I think we had a resolution to study the feasibility of setting up a veterinarian school within the four states sometime here, either last year or the year before. What has been the results of that? I know we have studied it.

SENATOR KREMER: I'm aware of the Cole report when Dr. Cole was employed to make a feasibility study of this project. I'm aware of that report. I don't recall a study that was made by the Legislature. Perhaps I've forgotten it.

SENATOR KEYES: I didn't say it was by the Legislature, Senator Kremer, I said the study has been made.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk. We have an amendment to the resolution.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to amend LR 40 to provide that paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 read The Governors of the several states represented in The Old West Regional Commission. Signed Senator Mills.
