213, 370, 257A, 180

PRESIDENT: Debate ceases. Senator Rasmussen, will you close on your motion to advance.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: No closing.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall this bill be advanced? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 10 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Maresh asks unanimous consent to print amendment to LB 30 in the Legislative Journal. Committee on Committees gives a report. Mr. President, Reference Committee refers LB 524. Mr. President, your committee on Public Works to whom was referred LB 87 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File. Mr. President, your committee...Signed Senator Kremer. Mr. President, Miscellaneous Subjects indefinitely postpones LB 213 and 370. Signed Senator Dworak. Mr. President, notice of Banking, Commerce and Insurance executive session at 1 o'clock on 3/30. Signed Senator DeCamp. Mr. President, an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Duis will be inserted in the Journal. (See pages 1150-1152.) Mr. President, LB 257A I suppose would properly come before us.

PRESIDENT: In the South balcony, Senator Cope has some very good friends, Mr. and Mrs. George Geisler of Kearney. They are with Mrs. Cope. Would the Geisler's please stand and be recognized. We have yet to move 257A. Senator Rasmussen.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 257A - read title. There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, I think we had better hold that up. It would be completely different after the amendments. It can catch up.

PRESIDENT: All right.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Do it on Select? Okay, I will move the advancement.

PRESIDENT: Senator Duis. The question is, shall this bill be advanced? Record your vote. Have you voted?

CLERK: 25 ayes, 9 nays.

PRESIDENT: That bill is advanced. LB 180.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 180 has been considered. There is a request by Senator Goodrich to lay it over until 3/30. Is that correct, Senator Goodrich?

PRESIDENT: Senator Glenn Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Is this 180?

PRESIDENT: Yes.
