LB 230, 230A, 77

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read vote on page 1161 of the Journal. 43 ayes, 2 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 230 passes. Will the Clerk read for the Final Reading LB 230A?

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read LB 230A.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is shall the bill pass. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Read vote on page 1162 of the Journal. 44 ayes, 0 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: LB 230A passes. Read on Final Reading, Mr. Clerk, LB 77.

ASSISTANT CLERK: There's a motion on the desk Mr. President.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Read the motion.

ASSISTANT CLERK: I move to bracket LB 77. Signed Senator Jack Mills.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Mills is not present. Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Does Senator Mills have a specific motion on the bill?

ASSISTANT CLERK: The specific motion is to bracket. There's no date on the bracketing motion.

SENATOR SCHMIT: If Senator Mills has any idea about amending the bill, I would not object to having it laid over for a period of time and give him a chance to explain what he's talking about. I really do not see any reason for holding the bill unless he does have some idea. I do not want to read the bill if there is going to be a problem later on with my being charged with uncooperativeness. Does anyone else have any idea about this bill?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. President, let's read the bill. We've been through this for two years. Let's vote it up or down. I oppose the motion.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I would not oppose the motion to bracket. I would...I want it understood that I'm not going to oppose the motion to bracket. If Senator Mills has a motion on the bill, I'd be willing to let it lay over.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Chair is going to recognize Senator Dick Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I talked to Senator Mills. He's at the doctors. He hoped to be back here before we finished Final Reading. Would it be permissible to pass over it at this time and read it last on Final Reading?
