

between committee amendments and consent amendments. The consent amendments are the amendments brought forth by the people that have been studying this on Tuesday nights. It does not mean that that was adopted all in whole by that Committee. It was a consensus opinion by that group to try to amend the code, the same as Senator Venditte amends the marijuana laws if he doesn't like it. It is a group that got together and tried to amend this Code. They've offered these amendments. It's not a Committee amendment whatsoever. It is amendments by this group.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you very much. You're stating that the word "consent" has no value as a consent from your Committee, or from this Legislature, or anyone else.

SENATOR BARNETT: None whatsoever.

SENATOR KELLY: Okay. Now I got the picture. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I'd just like to take a couple of minutes and say Senator Venditte, get up and start asking the questions because you came back here wanting to know what was going on. I tried to explain it to you, this is not the Committee amendments, this is not what the Committee brought to the floor. The bill is what the Committee brought to the floor. In this discussion the other night, these seven or eight senators thought, not all of them, the consensus was that this is what should be done after thinking this Section through. Now is the time to stand up here and ask the questions. Don't wait till it's over. If the bill is like it is they've accepted the first amendments on page 126. On 127 what they're doing is they're figuring that pimping shouldn't be a Class III felony, it ought to be a Class IV felony. From 20 years to 5 years, that is what they've amended, and that is what they're trying to do. You should look at the other part because some of these sections are carried and covered in the sexual assault laws. You have to compare the two when you work together. You can adopt the amendment, or you don't have to. It doesn't make any difference to me. That is fine. I'm trying to explain the difference between who brings these amendments to the floor and what comes out of the Committee. With that explanation I guess that is all I can say.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature. I would like to ask Senator Reutzel a question. You listed some of the things that are considered Class III felonies and felt that pimping didn't belong with those things. Would you mention two or three of those things again. That's alright. I'll take it from whoever did the documentary work. I'm not challenging the validity or correctness of it.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Manslaughter, first degree assault, use of a fire arm to commit a felony, use of explosive to kill or injure a person.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: First degree assault. Thank you Senator Reutzel. Members of the Legislature, pandering is a vicious, low-down, dirty activity. When movies are made about prosti-
