

CLERK: LB 456. Read on Final Reading.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1260, Journal.)
45 ayes, 0 nays, 4 not voting.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Warner, did you wish attention before I announce the vote. LB 456 passes. The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, just a point of information for the members that the green sheet that shows the expenditures and receipts and so forth have not been adjusted today for the Governor's message yesterday and for the reason that the staff is still making sure. The letter we had was a total amount. We had to check with them to make sure that we get the reductions attached to the right bills so it will be included on tomorrow's but they are not on today's.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Thanks, Senator Warner. That will conclude Final Reading. We will then proceed to special order, criminal code, LB 38, and I believe Senator Chambers has been excused and I believe withdrew his, am I correct, Mr. Clerk? It was never offered so there is no motion offered. So we are then still on the motion to indefinitely postpone by Senator Venditte, is that correct?

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is made by Senator Venditte to indefinitely postpone LB 38.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Venditte.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, Mr. President, how many people will there be to speak on this motion? There is just one other person beside myself. Is Senator Simon in the Chamber?

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Simon is not at his desk, Senator Venditte, but did you want him to respond to a question.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Yes, please.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Would the Sergeant at Arms locate Senator Simon please. Senator Simon, if you are in hearing distance, would you please return to the Chamber for response to a question of Senator Venditte.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. President, if you will go to the next person who has a light on now. Certainly, I will stand by.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Why don't we just wait for a moment here. Or you may, if you have any further comments, you may go ahead while we are waiting.

SENATOR VENDITTE: No, I don't at this point in time, Mr. President, but I will certainly wish to close at the end.
