

section does. There is a comparison in here, Senator Maresh, that tells what the laws were and what they are now and there will be two sections in here which will be new. So we start with section 191, and this is a Class I misdemeanor of obstructing government operations and defines that the offense is intentionally obstructing, impairing or perverting the administration of law by force, violence, physical interference, breach of official duty. This section excepts the flight by a person charged with crime, refusal to submit to arrest, failure to perform compliance with law without affirmative interference with governmental functions. This is comparable to section 28-737 in the present law. It is nothing more than what we have today. Section 192 provides that every person engaged in the practice of medicine and surgery shall report every case in which he treats a wound or injury of violence which appears to have been received in connection with a commission of a criminal offense, and this is the new one, this is one of the new sections, and this report shall be made to the Chief of Police or the Sheriff and shall include the name of such person, their residence and the description of the injury. Now this is a new thing in the criminal code which there is no comparable statute in present law. Section 193 provides for the Class II misdemeanor of refusing to aid a peace officer and this section compares with the present statute in 28-728 and, basically, is the same thing we have in law today. Section 194 provides for the offense of resisting arrest where one intentionally prevents a peace officer from affecting an arrest and this resisting arrest is a Class I misdemeanor and resisting arrest through the use of deadly or dangerous weapons is a Class IV felony and this is comparable with what we have in sections 28-729 and 729.01 and that is what we have today in the law. 195 provides for a Class I misdemeanor of operating a motor vehicle to avoid arrest or citation for the violation of any law of the State of Nebraska, the city or village ordinance. It is comparable to section 60-430 which is in the motor vehicle sections of law, the traffic infractions, in that area. Section 196 is obstructing a peace officer when one threatens to use violence, force, physical interference and intentionally obstructs and we just took out the part where the officer was acting in an illegal manner and this section is comparable to 28-729 of present statutes. 197 is a false reporting, when one furnishes information he knows to be false is a Class I misdemeanor to any police officer with the intent to instigate an investigation of an alleged criminal matter or impeded the investigation of an actual criminal matter at this time. It is comparable to the same section of law we have, 28-744, in the present statutes of criminal law. 198 provides for Class I misdemeanor of interfering with a fireman on official duty which we have in present law. That is obstructing, getting in the road, pinching off the fire hose. You could do all kinds of things to obstruct, you can take equipment from the rigs and everything. This is the same as we have under 28-730. 199 provides for a Class I misdemeanor of falsifying records of a public utility, when any person shall knowingly falsify any record of a public utility and this is identical to 28-712 which we have in present law. Section 200, this is for filing false reports with regulatory bodies, same as we have in present law, 28-713. Section 201, this is a Class II misdemeanor for the abuse of public records, make false entries, you alter the records.
