

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Chair recognizes Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I thought this was for one person. Well I realize that you're saying not more than two now, but at the time of the presentation of the bill I thought it was just applicable to the one person.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Senator Duis, did you wish to have Senator Marsh respond to that?

SENATOR DUIS: Well I guess maybe I don't quite understand the bill as well as I did in committee. I thought this was just in the case of a voter who needed someone to help them. I understand that, but I thought this was a one person situation, but I guess I was mistaken.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Chair recognizes Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, colleagues. I just very briefly rise in support of Senator Marsh's amendment. I think this will allow for, or not preclude anybody that may be handicapped to be brought to the polls. But it certainly is a kind of safeguard that would allow, a safeguard that we need to get involved in some type of block voting. I think it's a sound amendment, a sensible amendment, an amendment that could possibly curtail some abuses in the future.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Any further discussions on the Marsh amendment? Senator Duis, you didn't wish to speak again, did you? Alright. Senator Marsh, you may close on your amendment. No closing. The motion before the House is the adoption of the Marsh amendment to LB 201. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to adopt.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: The Marsh amendment is adopted. Any further amendments? Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move that LB 201, as amended, be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: Motion to advance LB 201 to E & R for engrossment. Is there any further discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. LB 201 is advanced to E & R for engrossment. That completes all the bills on Select File for today. We will then move to item number nine on the agenda, resolutions. LR 46 is first up. In the absence of Senator Schmit, does someone else want to take this. Senator Burrows, almost all of the names on this resolution, named parties on this resolution are not present or excused. Did you want to take this up, or did you want to lay it over? This is LR 46.

SENATOR BURROWS: I would just as soon we'd lay it over since the members signing it are not present.

SPEAKER LUEDTKE: We'll just leave it on the resolutions list if that is what you'd care to do because you're the only other one on.
