

CLERK: Read Duis amendment found on page 1235 of the Journal.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Duis.

CLERK: Mr. President, there's a second page to that, my apologies. (Continued to read Duis amendment).

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you. That was real necessary because that renumbers the sections. Mr. President, members of the Legislature. If you will note from the....

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Duis, just a second. Senator George is raising his hand back there. I'd like to see if it's a point of order.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. Chairman, could we possibly treat those two amendments as two separate amendments? I would like to have those separated. The first page that you read, that was one amendment, and the second one that the Clerk just read, I would consider that a second amendment. I would like to have them treated as two separate amendments.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator George, the Clerk explains that the first amendment he could understand splitting that one, but between the first and second amendment, the second one is just renumbering sections, if we're following your reasoning. Is that correct? Does the Chair understand you?

SENATOR GEORGE: No. That second page here is a separate amendment, which the Clerk just read as "on three strike the new matter in line 13, and strike, beginning with there in line 27, through the period on page 4, line 6". That is a different amendment.

CLERK: Well that's a different amendment, that's not even before us.

SENATOR GEORGE: That's what you just read.

CLERK: No, that's a different amendment. I haven't read that one yet.

SENATOR GEORGE: Oh, you haven't read that?

CLERK: No.

SENATOR BARNETT: He's on Senator Duis' amendment, Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Yes, you just added one more section then. I don't have it in front of me. Could you repeat that.

CLERK: The last page is "on page 2, line 5, after "and" insert "also". Number 3. Renumber sections".

SENATOR GEORGE: Oh, that's just renumbering sections.

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you. That's alright with me.

SENATOR BARNETT: Now that we've got that, Senator Duis go ahead.
