

legitimate needs of the citizens of this state and I suggest that what I have seen here and what I have pointed out to you is not a legitimate way to proceed. If it's legitimate to advertise a half-page ad to give money away, then it ought to be legitimate to carry the same kind of ad when you propose rules and regulations that restrict and control the citizens of this state. Members of the body, I hope that you pass the resolution and give the committee a chance to assist our Welfare Department to do the kind of a job that I know they are capable of doing.

SENATOR MARVEL: The question is to adopt LR 50. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. It takes 25 votes. Voting aye, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Marvel voting aye.

SENATOR MARVEL: Have you all voted? Clerk record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays.

SENATOR MARVEL: Motion carried and the resolution is adopted.

CLERK: 27 ayes, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Merz, did you want LR 48 passed over? Did you ask unanimous consent? Senator Merz asked unanimous consent that we lay over LR 48 till tomorrow. Is there an objection? If not, so ordered. Senator Maresh, do you wish to take up LR 52?

CLERK: Legislative Resolution 52. It's found on page 1304 of the Legislative Journal. Read LR 52.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This was a formality that the Business and Labor Committee had to go through to have a hearing on this resolution which includes a contract between two locals and the Department of Labor. The hearing lasted about 15 minutes. There was no opposition to the contract and the committee decided to sponsor LR 52 and have it approved by the entire body here. So, I move that LR 52 be adopted by the Legislature.

SENATOR MARVEL: There a second to the motion? Is there any discussion? If not, all those in favor of adopting LR 52 vote aye, opposed vote no. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Marvel voting aye.

SENATOR MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

SENATOR MARVEL: Motion carried and resolution is adopted. Senator Chambers, are you ready to take up your motion under Item number 9 which has to do with Rule 3, Section 10B?
