CLERK: Read motion. (Refer to page 1367).

SENATOR BARNETT: You've all heard the motion on the floor, the appropriations bills the introduction of. All in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Senator Barnett voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Barnett voting aye.

SENATOR BARNETT: It takes 30 votes for the introduction of the appropriations bills at the request of Senator Warner. Have you all voted? Would the senators pay attention please? It takes 30 votes. Have you all voted? Clerk record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 1 nay to suspend the rules.

SENATOR BARNETT: Motion passes.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President I move to for the introduction of Request Nos. 848, 847, 858, and 857. Signed Senator Warner.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Warner.
