LB 274, 518, 33

Senators, please return to your desks. Commence reading LB 274.

CLERK: Read title to LB 274.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 274 pass. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: Read record vote found on pages 1373 and 1374 of the Journal. 40 ayes, 2 nays, 3 present and not voting, 4 absent and not voting.

PRESIDENT: LB 274 passes. We go to Special Order on LB 33.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Attorney General has issued an opinion to Senator Goodrich, which will be printed in the Journal relative to county assessors. Mr. President, Senator Keyes asked unanimous consent to print amendments in the Journal to LB 518. Mr. President, Senator Barnett asked to print amendments in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: In the South balcony we have a delegation from Clay County. There are 32 high school seniors from Clay Center High School. This is in Senator Kremer's district. We appreciate you people being with us. Hope you enjoy your day. They're smiling because it rained a lot in Clay County last night.

CLERK: Mr. President, an explanation of vote by Senator Savage on LB 274. Mr. President, we had no further amendments on Article 10. We considered them the last day we considered this bill; on Article 10 of LB 33.

PRESIDENT: We go to Article 12 then? Alright. Apparently, there has been some arrangement that we are to lay over Article 11, so that will deviate from the progression we've followed.

SENATOR BARNETT: We're going to try to have an answer about 11 by tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: What is your purpose now? To give an overview of 12 and then go into some amendments?

SENATOR BARNETT: Yes. We have no amendments on Article 12. There may be some on the desk. I think I have one personally, and I think Senator Koch might have one.

PRESIDENT: Well is ten minutes, Senator, for your overview?

SENATOR BARNETT: I can do the overview in about two minutes, then I have to go through Article 12 which has 30 or 40 sections. That's our procedure that we've been following.

PRESIDENT: Okay, alright. You're recognized Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: If you want to you can turn to pages 189 to 222 in the green copy of LB 38. This is Article 12 in the Criminal Code. This is entitled "The Offenses Against Public Health and Safety". This is the unlawful conduct which constitutes a hazard to public health and safety. There are provisions in this Article, the use of firearms and explosives, and the penalties, the various licensing and permit provisions,

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
