

SEN. MARVEL: Is there any objection? Senator DeCamp objects.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I let them bracket it for three weeks already once, when they raised even a question, got it checked out, told you what the amendments did. I just don't see any reason to bracket it. Senator Burrows opposes it because it does exactly what I say, as he claims. Senator Lewis....

SEN. MARVEL: I'm sorry but we're on the motion to bracket. You want to make the motion, then we can respond.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Then I'd like to speak to it first before Senator DeCamp refutes it. That's the normal course of debate.

SEN. MARVEL: You're recognized on the motion to bracket Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: First of all, Senator DeCamp I appreciate it that you let us bracket it for three weeks and I thought in good spirits you would let us bracket it again. However, if that is not your preference then, Mr. President, I would move that we bracket the bill. I knew there was something about the bill that I had an interest in but I didn't put things together and I apologize, but there's a bill, 431, that addresses this question also, that addresses it in a more significant fashion and I understand now the reason why people don't want that particular bill is because they think this subterfuge of something under the guise of a bill will provide the necessary thrust, Senator Chambers, to say that we have done something in this area. I think Senator DeCamp would be well advised to allow the membership an opportunity to look at both of those bills and compare what we're trying to do in this particular area. Senator DeCamp has come before you as only he can do and this is a compliment Senator DeCamp, it takes a great skill and agility to present to you a bill that does nothing except issue a certificate and tell you its of important state significance that we pass it. Now I think that I understand the plan that we pass this one and that we have made some significant reforms so we don't need to address 431. Well if that's the case that may be wonderful but I'm asking, and I know a reasonable person would want to go along with it, that we bracket the bill until we have a chance to analyze it. Now, I didn't ask it to be bracketed for three weeks. I asked for a week. Now Senator DeCamp, I would renew my motion to ask unanimous consent, if you have decide to have a change in heart to have the membership take a full look at this issue. If not, there's going to be substitute amendments to it. So Mr. Chairman, with those comments, I would request and ask that we bracket the bill for one week.

SEN. MARVEL: OK, I was checking to see whether the motion was debatable and I guess according to the rules it is. So Senator DeCamp, do you wish to be recognized on the motion?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I have a confession, it really is. It's a plot to take over the United States, that's what the bill is, just like Senator Chambers suggested. So indifference to all you people that want to ferret out the plot, I'm going to go along and consent to let you figure it out and find where it is in there. It's somewhere, you just got to find it.
