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need to correct now. Senator Schmit agrees with him and when Schmit and Bereuter agree on a land use bill, I even read it. That could have been done in an orderly process. But instead we want to get a little motion pad in our hot grubby hands and run up there and set it for a date when we know it's impossible. You understand the rules as well as I do. You understand that Appropriation bills have first priority. As I understand it, Senator Warner, we're going to start on those Appropriation bills Monday. You bet they are going to have priority. I suspect that may be some length of debate. Then if you have the bill scheduled, bracketed for the 19th, and we don't debate it what do you do about that? On the 20th? We've wasted half a morning in trying to do something that is more chaotic than we could have made it. The Speaker has tried and I defend him and I defend his actions here and now to do this in an organized systematic way. The priority system by the vote of the entire committee, Senator Carsten, and I want that understood that was a motion that I made, that the entire committee would look at them not the chairman and say, what do we need to do. What bills do we need to address? What bills do we have a serious problem with that will not wait til next year? I could understand pandemonium and panic if this was the tail end but remember, gentlemen, this is the first session. Those bills will remain there. Those bills will be there in January and those bills in committee will be here. We don't have to rush to the gauntlet to get the bills passed unless there is a demand that we do something now, a demand that we have...

PRESIDENT: You have one minute, Senator.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: So, Senator Simon's motion does the same thing mine does and I'm going to renew it because Senator Simon, you won't have to repeat it every day. I have a motion up there that says we remove everything back like it was this morning before we wasted almost two hours.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I appreciate Senator Lewis' remarks and maybe my remarks earlier were out of order. But I assure you, Senator Lewis, that neither chairman of the two committees that I sat on had a meeting of our committees and informed us of this information that was made available to the chairmen by the Speaker. I think as far as I for one member of this body is concerned was dealt an injustice. It was not the first time this session that I have been left out. I appreciate that. But I don't believe this knowledge was fully explained to every member of the Legislature. For that procedure, I am objecting to and believe that it should be corrected. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I just want to say that I oppose Senator Lewis' motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simon, do you want to close debate on your motion?

SENATOR SIMON: Yes I do and I take it from Senator Schmit's comments that he's not opposed to my amendment. What my amendment does...
