I have none; I have no bills that I want to place up there on General File because the bills I have have been addressed and they are out of committee. That can be resolved next year. But I'm telling you this and I hate to be in this kind of a position because I like chaos better than anybody in here. But this chaos is getting too bad that somebody is going to have to say this and say it once. This is the last time I'm going to speak on the issue. But you better return right where we are and Senator Moylan, you'll be clapping when we hear about 730 one night too saying, oh can we get out of here? I'm not coming. Because we can do this in an organized process and operate at a reasonable level if we follow some kind of agenda. If we can't, we can't. But I am not going to be panicked into coming in here at 7:30 saying, let's get one more bill. Because we don't need it. We've got 10 or 12 or 14 or 16 substantive bills that ought to be debated, one of which they could have been handled this morning instead of somebody trying to play outcleverness and outcleverness created chaos and wasted 2 hours. Because everybody else tried to get an advantage. Now I'll tell you, you ought to return right to where we were this morning and move on with the agenda. If you don't, good luck because they are already laughing half way across the state now, that we can't set down an agenda and follow it in an organized, civilized way. It's the worst performance I've seen since I taught a study hall in '65.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I'd like to call the question.

PRESIDENT: Do I see five seconds? I do. The question is shall debate now cease. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 3 nays.

PRESIDENT: Debate ceases. The question now is shall Senator Lewis' motion pass. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 21 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: Motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: I move to bracket LB 408 until April 25. Signed Senator Chambers.
