

PRESIDENT: The report on the Committee on Committees is affirmed.

CLERK: Senator Barnett said that he didn't have his full hour this morning on the criminal code.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett, we still have slightly in excess of 15 minutes left of our hour on LB38. I understand that you have a couple of amendments left on Article 13.

SENATOR BARNETT: Well, if that is the...that is what I understood. I don't want to cause any....

PRESIDENT: No, your...it was my understanding and it happened when I was here that Senator Chambers motion was not to be credited or charged against the hour. That took approximately 15 minutes so....

SENATOR BARNETT: We can handle them in very short order. Senator Fowler is ready with them. It won't take very long. One is just a correction of what is in the....

PRESIDENT: Alright. Chair recognizes Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Will the Clerk read the Barnett amendment.

CLERK: Read Barnett amendment found on page 1377 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR FOWLER: Okay, the striking of this section is because there is a later Section 328 on page 238 of the criminal code that is almost identical language. So, we are striking the Section 313 that is talking about maintenance of a nuisance but that same language almost identically is in another section of the criminal code. So, we are not really removing any penalty. Or any crime either. So, I would move the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the amendment proposed by Senator Fowler. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted Senator. Do you have another one Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR FOWLER: There should be another one.

CLERK: Read Barnett amendment located on page 1377 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR FOWLER: Okay, this is probably more appropriately called the Neil Simon amendment because it deals with the sale of diseased meat and....the Section 314 says that it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale the flesh of a diseased animal whether such animal shall have died of disease or butchered in a diseased condition. It goes on to say that any person violating a provision of this section shall be guilty of a Class five felony. There is no such thing in
